The 2015 edition of our fly-in was a great success, thanks to the efforts of the many French Wing volunteers who gathered into various teams to deal with security, service, cooking, sales, preparation and decoration... Without them, the fly-in would not have been possible and we wish to thank them for their fine service.

Perfect weather and Laurent Cluzel's retro musical atmosphere gave us great expectations for the day. While the final preparations were taken care of, our guests began to arrive - some of them in uniforms or 1940s outfits. A splendid Stearman buzzed the hangar, soon to be followed by many other vehicles and airplanes: three DHC Chipmunk, four Stearman, a Yak-18T, a Hatz biplane, two Piper Cubs, an Aero 3, a Bücker Jungmann, a Christen Eagle, a T-6 "Texan", a Staggerwing, a Norvigie, a Waco, a Jodel, a Cessna 195 and a Sirocco... As far as ground vehicles were concerned, the alignment of jeeps, trucks, Kübelwagen and Ford Vedette extended to the neighbouring hangar.

The "Spirit of Lewis" was up in the air early and flew all day long, totalling 10 flights in 4 hours!

This is the atmosphere in which our 130 guests were able to enjoy the French Wing's complimentary apéritif and barbecue. Many visitors, who had not booked or simply showed up, had lunch next door at our friend Valérie's snack.

Good times always pass quickly, and the hangar's surroundings began to clear up at the end of the afternoon. However, the day wasn't quite over yet. A final flight was planned, so that aerial photos of the Norvigie (which is now flying again) could be taken.
